Players Code of Conduct

The Ladies Gaelic Football Association wish to provide the best possible environment for all young players involved in Ladies Gaelic Football. Young Players deserve to be given enjoyable, safe sporting opportunities, free of abuse of any kind. These players have rights, which must be respected and responsibilities that they must accept

Young players are entitled to:

- 1.Be safe and to feel safe
- 2.Be listened to and be believed
- 3.Be treated with respect, dignity and sensitivity
- 4.Have a voice in the Club / Organization
- 5.Participate on an equal basis
- 6.Have fun and enjoy playing Ladies Gaelic Football
- 7.Experience competition at a level at which they feel comfortable
- 8.Make complaints and have them dealt with
- 9.Get help against bullies
- 10.Say **NO**
- 11.Protect their own bodies
- 12.Confidentiality

Young players should always:

- 1.Treat all mentors (coaches, managers, selectors, club officials etc.) with respect
- 2.Play fairly
- 3.Abide by the rules of the Association both on and off the playing field
- 4.Respect team members – even when things go wrong
- 5.Respect opponents – be gracious in defeat
- 6.Behave according to their Code of Conduct when traveling to away events
- 7.Behave in a manner that avoids bring the sport of Ladies Gaelic Football into disrepute
- 8.Talk to children’s officer if they have any problems

Young playes should never:

1. Cheat
2. Use violence or physical contact that is not allowed within the rules
- 3.Shout or argue with officials, team mates or opponents
- 4.Harm team members, opponents or their property
- 5.Bully or use bullying tactics to isolate another player
- 6.Use unfair or bullying tactics to gain advantage
- 7.Take banned substances
- 8.Keep secrets, especially if they have been caused harm
- 9.Tell lies about adults / other players
- 10.Spread rumours

The aim of our Club is the promotion of ladies football in our area and to provide a healthy activity in a safe environment for our members. We endeavour to ensure all our members get maximum enjoyment from our sport

CLUB RULES

1. A mother or female over the age of 18 must be present at all training sessions where there are underage players.
2. Registration must be paid by due date.
3. **All members** must show respect to all other members of our Club, to all teams, mentors, match referees and officials we meet in competition.
4. There is **ZERO TOLERANCE** in our Club regarding disruptive behaviour and bullying.
All incidents where a girl has to be spoken to 3 times or is continuously disruptive will be noted in the incident book, parents / guardians will be involved (for those U/18) as will our disciplinary committee.
5. All members must be on time for training sessions and matches. Managers must be notified if a member is unable to attend training or a match fixture.
6. A list will be taken of those attending training and matches – this is for safety reasons.
7. All injuries must be noted and the appropriate action taken including parent / guardian being notified. All insurance claims must be dealt with efficiently as all claims must be handed in within TWO months of injury. Please read Accident Fund Summary.
8. Strictly **NO CAMERA MOBILE PHONES** allowed in or around dressing room area including toilets.
9. Anyone wishing to take photographs or videotape at training and matches must notified and get permission from the Club.
10. All mentor positions must be applied for (application forms are available) and ratified by the Club Executive

A summary of the Accident Fund Guidelines

1. All players must be registered.
2. All injuries must be reported to the Team Manager.
3. All submissions of claims must be made within two months of date of injury.
4. Where a claim cannot be made within the two-month period a preliminary notification form should be completed.
5. Where treatment is likely to exceed 200, prior permission must be sought from the treasurer (Central Council) regarding the continuation of the treatment.
6. Any request for private treatment must be supported by documentation from a medical practitioner to show the reasons why private treatment is necessary.
7. The injured member will make payment to Doctor / Physio.
8. When making a claim to the accident fund, original receipts must be included with completed accident fund application form which has been signed by the relevant team manager and then returned to the Club Secretary.
9. All payments being made by the accident fund will go directly to the applicant
